PATIENT SPOTLIGHT: MEET NICOLE



In sickness and in health – just one of the vows Nicole and her husband Chris swore to each other when they married. Just six months later, this vow would be put to its first test.

It was a usual Saturday - Nicole was at work when she started feeling dizzy, and hives appeared on her neck and chest. Taking the rest of the day off, she took the bus home. What should have been a seven minute walk took her half an hour. “I don’t even remember the time going by.”

Over the past few months, Nicole had been working 60 hours a week at two different jobs, so she thought she just needed some rest. By Sunday, Nicole was so exhausted she could barely walk and needed her husband to help her out of bed. When she woke up on Monday, she felt even worse. “My feet and legs went from tingling to numb.” It was then that the couple decided to go to the hospital.

After bloodwork, doctors told Nicole that she was just stressed and sent her home. Over the next two days, Nicole got progressively worse. She broke down crying as Chris once again helped her get out of bed. “I just knew something was really wrong.”

Her husband wrapped her up in her winter coat and boots and back to the hospital they went. More blood tests, then a CT scan, MRI and lumbar puncture. “I’m terrified of needles, so the lumbar puncture was definitely the worst,” she says. “My husband bribed me by promising to go skydiving with me. He hates heights!”

As the tests continued, doctors were ruling out meningitis, Multiple Sclerosis, and Lyme disease. Ten days later, she was sent to a neurologist who told her the diagnosis – Guillain Barre Syndrome or GBS.

GBS is a disease that attacks the nerves. Its first symptoms are usually mistaken for the cold or flu, and the disease starts mostly in the legs. If not treated, weakness and tingling followed by numbness can paralyze the whole body, including the lungs. The exact cause of Guillain Barre Syndrome is unknown.

After the diagnosis, Nicole was sent to ICU so doctors could monitor her for any respiratory difficulties. Thankfully, there were no further complications and she was in a regular room the next day.

While she did a little physiotherapy in the an acute hospital, she was soon transferred to Hotel Dieu Shaver. Nicole had three hours of therapy a day, and part of it included the Therapeutic Pool. “I finally felt weightless - I just wanted to be in the pool all the time,” she remembers.

On her first day at Hotel Dieu Shaver, Nicole had arrived in a wheelchair, needing help to get in and out. On her last day, she walked out with only a cane for support. A year later, she ditched the cane.

Nicole is determined to make up for lost time, and she and her husband have since travelled extensively. They’ve been horseback riding, whale watching, and are planning a trip to Europe. Nicole decided to go to college, and graduated in June. She also joined a support group for GBS to help others understand the disease and how to manage it.

“I just can’t imagine what would have happened if I didn’t come here,” she says. “I’m back. Hotel Dieu Shaver gave me a sense of normalcy.”
