\$500,000 PLANNING GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT



The provincial government announced on Friday, February 8th its approval for implementation of HDS' \$500,000 planning grant, allowing the hospital to continue in its work to develop new and enhanced rehabilitation bed capacity. Hotel Dieu Shaver welcomed Christine Elliott, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health and Long Term Care, Monte McNaughton, Minister of Infrastructure, and Sam Oosterhoff, MPP Niagara West. The extraordinary and dedicated work of all the staff, physicians and volunteers has helped to emphasis the significant role that rehabilitation services plays in improving the lives of so many - maximizing the patient's ability to regain their quality of life and lead as independent and confident a life as possible

- freeing up acute care beds, reducing the need for emergency department visits and acute care re-admissions, and for so many, preventing or delaying the need to enter a long term care home or other facility. MINISTER OF FAMILY, CHILDREN & SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT VISITS HDS



On Wednesday, January 9th, Honourable Jean-Yves Duclos, Minister of Family, Children and Social Development, announced a new parental sharing benefit from Hotel Dieu Shaver Health and Rehabilitation Centre. The idea behind the government's new employment insurance program is to give "more equal opportunities" for parents to raise their children. The five weeks of shared parental leave will be available in addition to the parental leave program that was already extended in 2017 up to 18 months. While Minister Duclos' was at HDS, he was able to visit the Steve Ludzik Centre for Parkinson's Rehab and meet with many of HDS' patients and caregivers. Minister Duclos also toured HDS' Courtyard Therapy Space, Boxing Ring, Marketplace and Carpentry areas.

HDS OT, Leslie Yole, is a member of a specialized Emergency Response Team in Niagara. This Emergency Response Pilot "FIT Team" (Falls Intervention Team) includes a Paramedic and an Occupational Therapist (OT). The team responds to 911 calls from Niagara Seniors who have fallen in their homes. The goal of adding these professional OT services during an Emergency Response is to reduce Emergency Department visits, as well as repeat falls. This segment was aired on Feb 18th, 2019 on CBC News – The National. The interview highlighted the role of the OT in assessing and addressing reasons for a fall.
