Hotel Dieu Shaver underwent the Accreditation process from September 24-26th, 2018. At the de-briefing session the Surveyors provided, they spoke in overwhelmingly positive terms of all facets of the facility and the care and attention the HDS team provides to their work and to our patients – and of the noticeable engagement and passion of staff, volunteers, physicians, patient advisors and Trustees. They also commented on the overwhelming support from our community partners and their expressed desire to "have more of our services". Although they acknowledged the challenges we face such as our aging facility and funding constraints, they noted the creative and innovative use of clinical space and the careful attention to the cleanliness and maintenance of the infrastructure. In short, the surveyors were very impressed with Hotel Dieu Shaver overall. The surveyors will make their recommendation to Accreditation Canada and then a formal announcement on our Accreditation status will be sent to us in the coming weeks.

PATIENT SPOTLIGHT: MEET BERNADETTE



It has been a difficult couple of years for Bernadette, but she is determined to never give up.

Bernadette's only daughter died during childbirth in 2015. A year later, her husband passed away. In 2017, while still dealing with the death of her husband, she was laid off from her job. She exhausted her benefits and her savings while looking for a new job.

Bernadette's husband did all of the driving, which meant she was nervous to drive too far from the city limits. This made finding a job more difficult. She finally saw an advertisement for a bookkeeper at Niagara Prosthetics and Orthotics. Things were looking up.

Four months later, Bernadette went to work as usual, did her groceries and planned her meals for the next week. The following day while she was chopping onions as she's done a million times, she felt her right arm losing strength. "Everything else felt fine. It was just my arm, so I ignored it," Bernadette recalled.

Remembering that her friend was coming by the next morning to take her to church, Bernadette texted her saying she had to cancel. It ended up being a good decision. That day, she felt her right leg weaken and she fell. She called her friend, who was at church, when she realized she couldn't get up. The pastor overheard the conversation and advised her to call an ambulance right away, as she was having a stroke.

Bernadette stayed one week at an acute hospital before being transferred to Hotel Dieu Shaver Hospital. "When I arrived, I couldn't walk or lift my right arm. I couldn't even get out of bed on my own," she remembers. "I was crying. I didn't know what my future would be."

Dr. McMillan, a physiatrist at Hotel Dieu Shaver, greeted her. "He told me, there are miracles happening here every day. Without his encouragement, I wouldn't have believed it."

HDS PREPARES FOR SINGLE SIGN-ON (SSO) SYSTEM

The hospital is preparing to upgrade their computers to Window's 10. The IT department will be slowly scheduling the new computers and software over the next few months. In addition, the staff will be receiving new Identification Badges similar to those used at Niagara Health. Each badge contains a chip with the user's computer log-in password. Specifically, each computer will be set-up with a card reader attached to it. Moving forward staff will be able to log-in their profile by tapping their ID card and the computer will know who they are and where they are signing in from within the hospital. The benefit of this system is efficiency, as staff will

only be required to enter their password once per day and then simply tap to access any application on their computer. The staff member's desktop is stored via the cloud and essentially follows the staff member throughout the building. HDS is scheduled to go live with this new system mid Dec.


